Familiar figure to address graduates

Former school secretary and bookkeeper Patti Zatica will serve as guest speaker Monday, May 19, 2008, for the Homedale High School graduation ceremony.

The ceremony takes place at 7 p.m. inside the high school gymnasium.

Leading honor graduate Mandy Paige Brasher serves as student speaker. The daughter of Craig and Rhonda Brasher, Mandy Brasher earned a 4.0 grade-point average throughout her high school career and came within one point of a perfect score on the ACT college entrance exam.

She plans to attend Dartmouth College in New Hampshire this fall. During her time at Homedale High, Brasher played volleyball and basketball for four years, participated in high school rodeo for three years, played softball for two seasons and wrapped up her athletics this spring on the tennis squad.

Brasher also served on the Science Club and the INL team for two years and also held the post of class secretary for two years.

Other highlights of the program include musical selection by the Homedale High School choir and band and a musical selection from Class of 2008 honor graduate Shruvan Sriganesh.

The Class of 2008 is comprised of 63 graduates, including exchange student Tony Frank Oehmichen from Germany. Nearly half of the graduating class — 29 students — attended Homedale schools from first grade to their senior years.

Mayor stumps for seniors' success

Marsing Mayor Keith Green said he never dreamed of holding public office, and yet he is in his first term leading the city. The adaptability necessary to cope with life's changes will be a theme during Green's address to the Marsing High School Class of 2008 next week.

"I never thought I'd speak to a senior class and I never thought I'd be in public office," Green said. "I'm going to tell them, 'You have to take what (life) gives you and make the best of it.'"

Marsing's graduation ceremony takes place at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, May 21, 2008, inside the Marsing High School gymnasium on Main Street.

Green said a handful of seniors asked him to serve as keynote speaker.

"I know so many of the seniors, and they came to me and asked me to do it," he said. "I asked them if they wanted a reality speech or a pump me up and send me on my way speech."

Green said the seniors opted for the motivational talk.

But he will include some issues that the students will deal with immediately when they step into the real world.

"I'll touch on the capabilities that they have in performing voting rights, and I'll touch on having fun at college," Green said.

The quick-witted mayor wants to instill the importance of maintaining a positive outlook on a daily basis.

"When they wake up in the morning, they have two choices: They can have a good day or they can have a bad day," he said. "Whatever life hands you, you can deal with it and you can move on."

This year's graduating class is led by valedictorian Stephanie Powell and salutatorian Ethan Cole Sauer.

Powell, 18, attained a perfect 4.0 grade-point average while at Marsing High. She's the daughter of Christopher Powell and Alison McKinney.

Powell will pursue an Associates Degree in Nursing at Treasure

Valley Community College.

She was this year's Homecoming Queen and Prom Queen and also participated in Student Council, the National Honor Society and the Choir.

Her hobbies include singing, playing guitar and piano and writing music.

Marsing's salutatorian is the son of Clay and Shauna Sauer.

Sauer also played one year of basketball and served as the vice-president of Marsing's chapter of the National Honor Society.


The graduating class colors are black and silver, and the class flower is the white rose.






